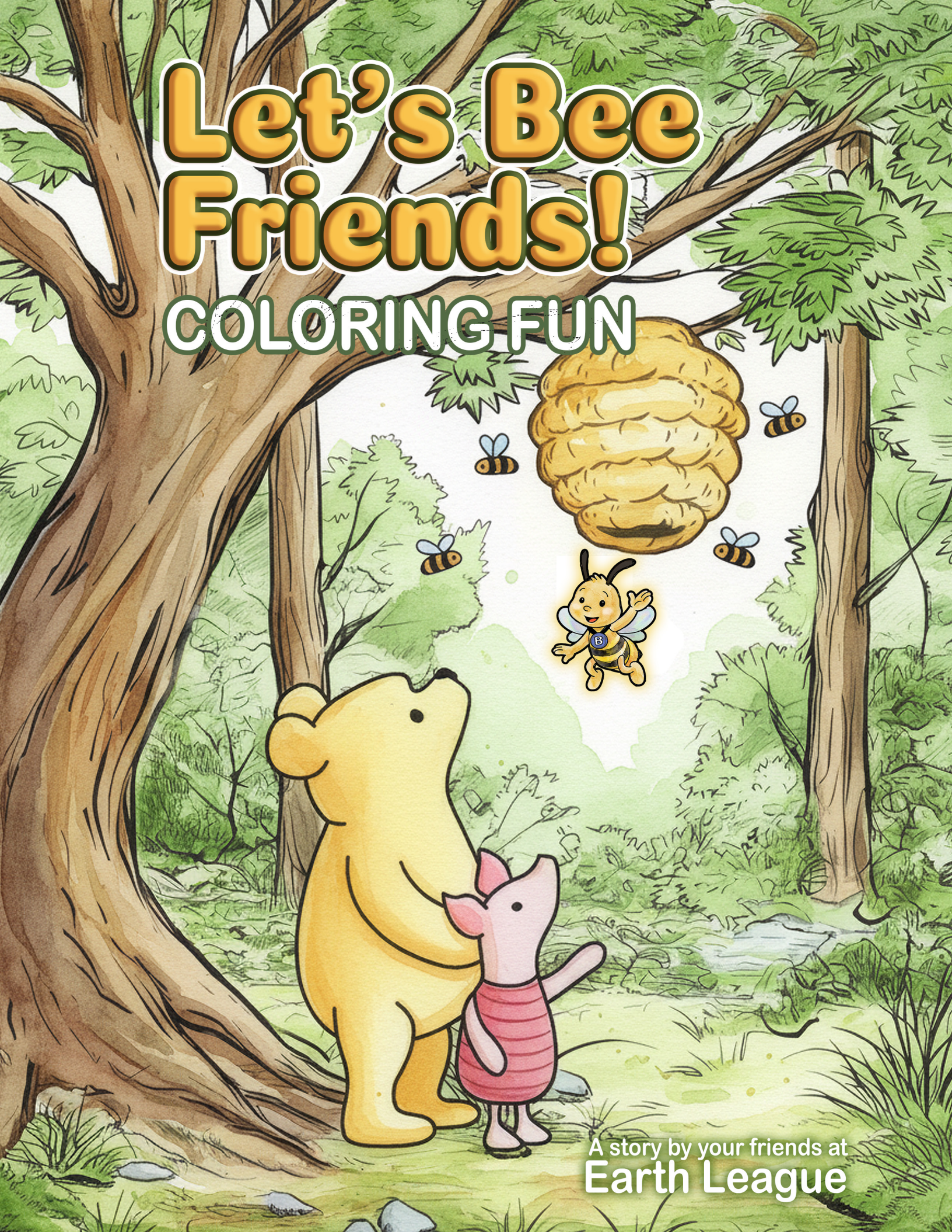

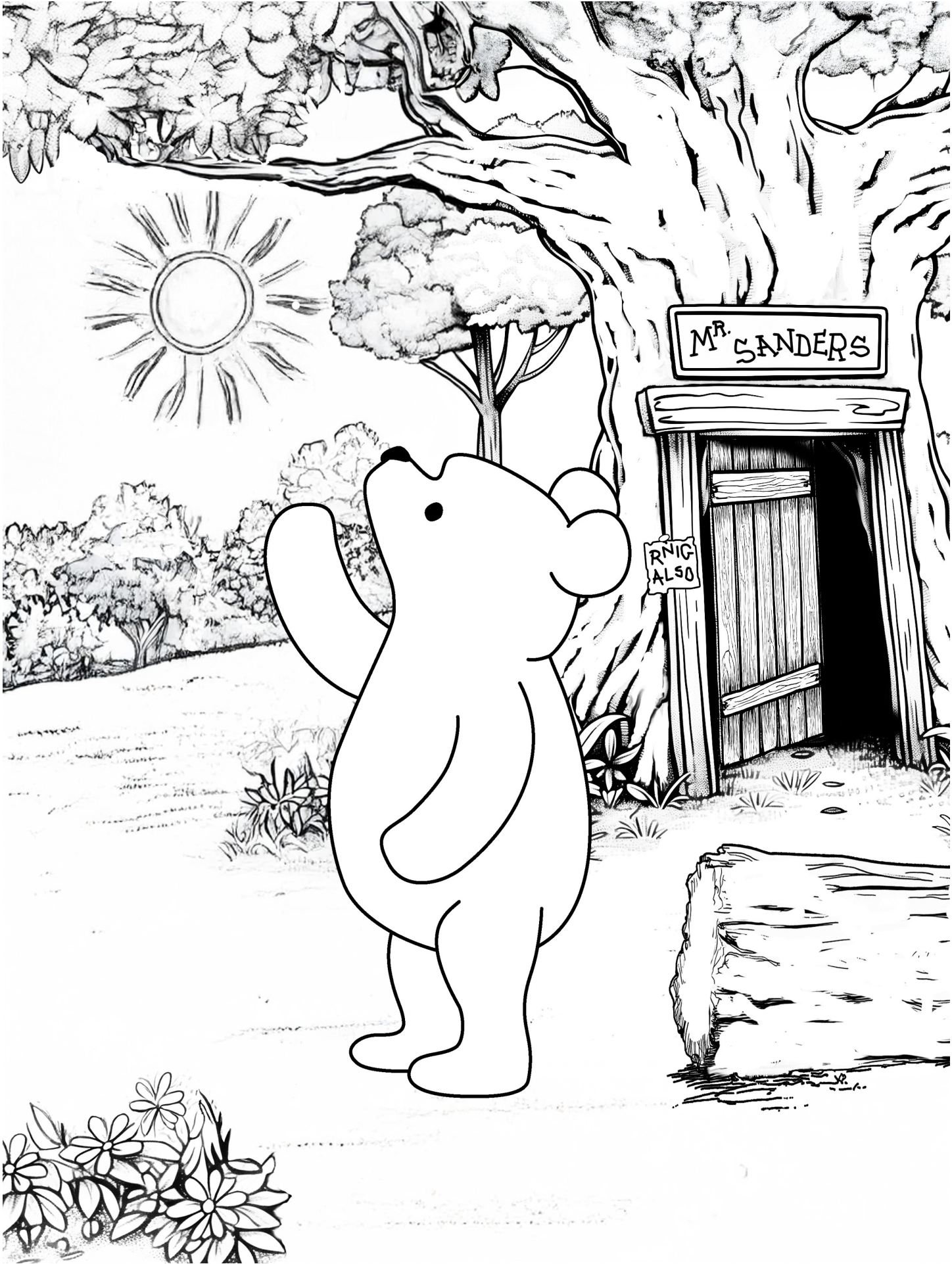

A tiny honeybee plopped onto a wilting petal, too tired to fly.

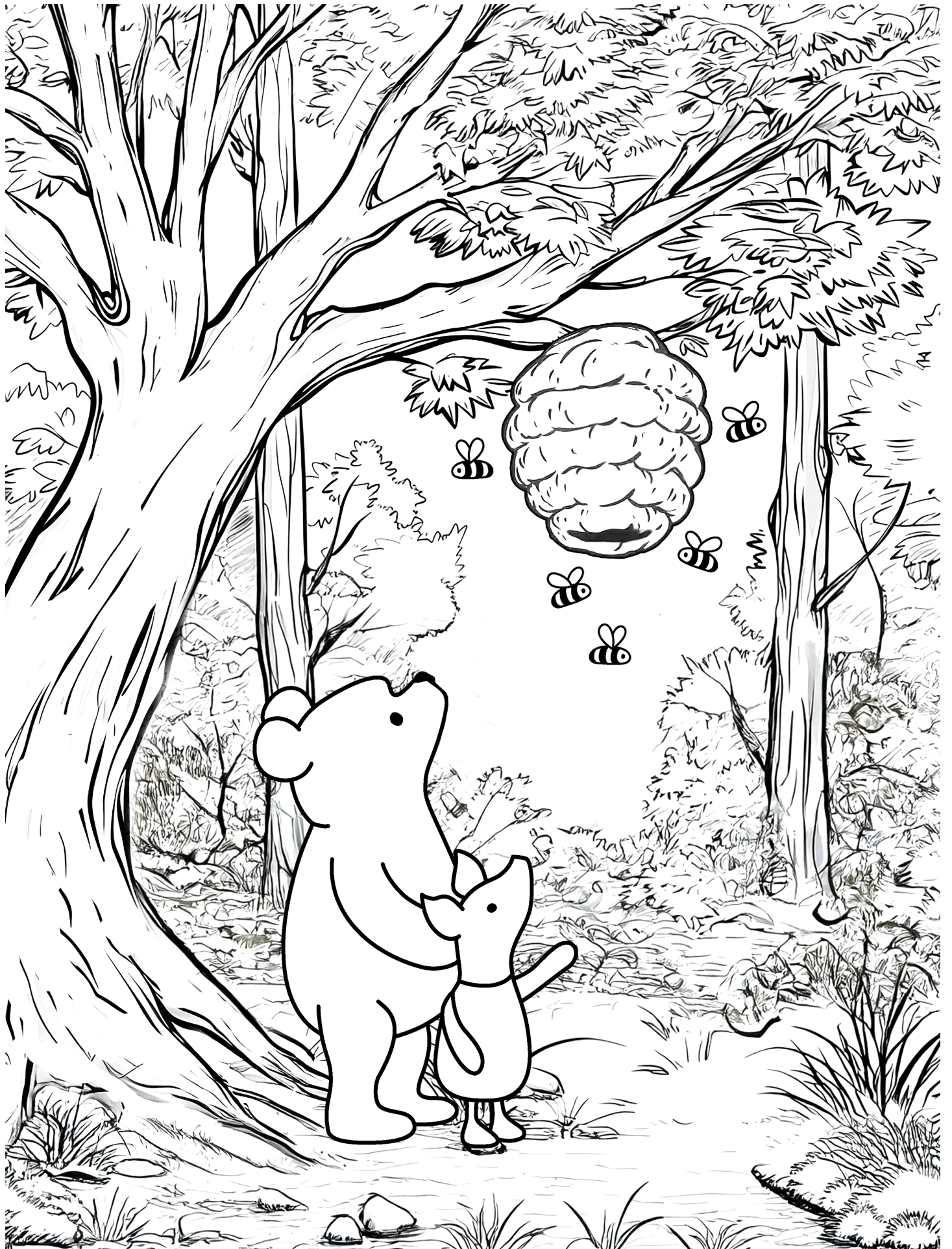
“Too few flowers,” the little bee said weakly. “Too little nectar.”

watched and waited.



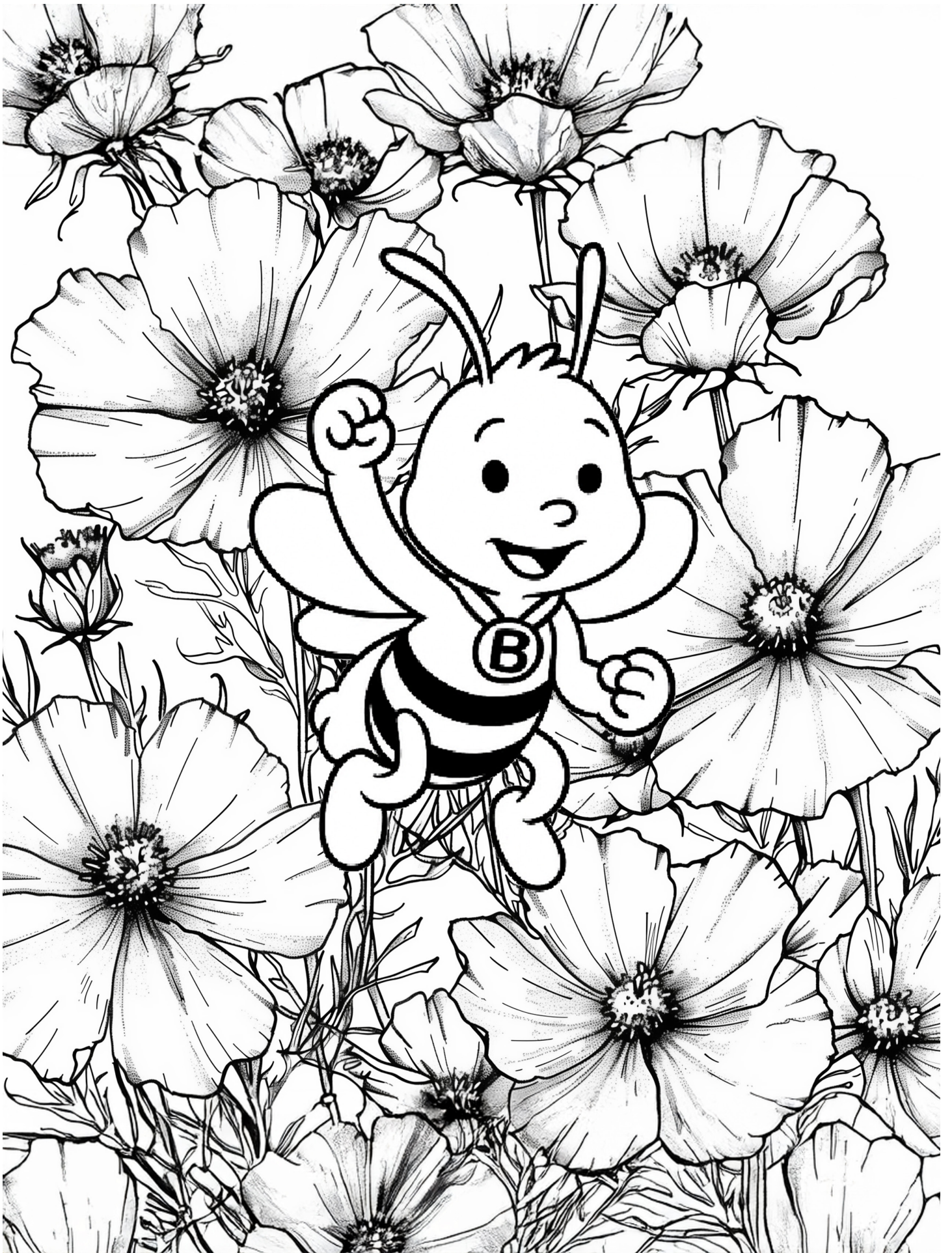
Soon bright flowers bloomed — and
